Following the undeniable success of the 'Tiny Tots' and 'Rising Stars' concept in past years, the Midlands Region is proud to offer the opportunity for all our newest dancers to share in the excitement and the build up to our most prestigious event in the Midlands calendar.

The presentation of our 'Mini Midlands' is for children up to and including Under 6 who have never participated in a graded competition, i.e., Novice.

This competition is aimed at our smallest children who love their dancing lessons but aren't quite ready for a full 32 bar dance. The children will be dancing to live reel music at the speed 124. Each child will have the opportunity to perform to 16 bars of music on our main stage and will be clapped in time.

Each Mini Midlands dancer will receive a special prize in recognition of their participation. Entry Fee is £15.00.

As a region we care deeply about our next generation of proud Irish dancers, this will be a celebration, this is for them.

NB - Mixed team competitions - A mixed team may dance at a Regional Oireachtas with a minimum of one male dancer

Please note the following:-

- Boys competing in a four hand Ceili Championship may not compete in any eight hand Ceili Championship either in their own age group or an older age group.
- Adult Ceili must perform any 8 Hand Ceili from Ar Rince Ceili. Adult Ceili members must not have competed in any solo, figure or ceili competitions, at any Feiseanna registered with CLRG since 1st January 2021. All teachers are asked to refer to CLRG syllabus for Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne 2024.
- 2024 World medal holders and qualifiers from this year's secondary qualifying must compete at Oireachtas Rince Lar Na Breataine 2024 to be eligible to compete at the World Championships 2025 unless they can provide certified Doctor's Note to the Secretary of the Midlands Regional Council in advance of Oireachtas Rince Lar Na Breataine 2024.
- Competitors must dance in numerical order as far as possible. If a dancer misses their turn they will not be allowed to dance.
- Objections regarding breach of rules should be made in writing by a teacher only. It should be accompanied by a £25.00 fee and handed to the Regional Council Secretary Jean Davis within 1 hour of the competition conclusion to which the objection is applicable. Each objection must be put in writing separately with the appropriate fee. If the objection is upheld the fee(s) will be returned.
- The Midlands Regional Council will not be held liable for the loss or theft of any personal belongings.
- No flash photography, mobile devices, digital cameras, cine filming or camcorders will be allowed whilst dancers are performing as per CLRG rule.
- The use of mobile phones in the hall is prohibited

.1. PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

- A minimum number of three Adjudicators must officiate.
- The age groups for a Preliminary Championships are Under 10 to U15 inclusive
- Where a Preliminary Championship is held separate from an Open Championship, three rounds should be offered, namely, Reel or Slip Jig, Heavy Jig or Hornpipe and any Set Dance.
- Where a Preliminary Championship is combined with an Open Championship, then the result should be taken from eligible dancers ranking after the first two rounds.
- Where there are separate Preliminary and Open Championships, dancers can compete in both at the discretion of the Feis organiser.
- Where a competitor wins two Preliminary Championships, they must dance in Open Championship for a period of 12 months thereafter.
 - For grading purposes, two wins will be taken as being in any two year rolling period. Where a dancer does not win a second Preliminary within two years of winning their first Preliminary Championship, then the first win will be deemed as having expired and the dancer starts afresh.
 - Where there are less than 6* in a Preliminary Championship that win will not normally be considered for grading purposes. However, where a dancer wins three Preliminary Championships regardless of the number of competitors in each competition, that dancer must dance in Open Championship for a period of 12 months thereafter.
- Dances performed in a Preliminary Championships do not count for grading in solo competitions.
 - Competitors that qualify for and compete in Oireachtas Rince Na Cruinne in the Previous 12 months cannot compete in a Preliminary Championship except where the dancer auto qualified at their Regional or National Oireachtas due to lack of Numbers.
- Dancers placing 1st 3rd in an Open Championship with up to 20* competitors or 1st 5th in an Open Championship with more than 20 Competitors cannot compete in a Preliminary Championship for a period of 12 month.

MRC Media Policy

- All photographs of competitors, competitions and presentations may only be taken for personal use. They may not be redistributed, sold, lent or passed on to third parties. They may also not be used for commercial purposes or used in any publication or website (all forms of social media – Facebook, Twitter, Instagram) without the express written permission of the organisers and the parents or guardians of dancers included therein.
- Oireachtas Organisers may appoint an official photographer for the event, who will take photographs of competitors, competitions, and presentations. Such photographs may be subsequently used for marketing and promotional purposes.
- Should any competitor or competitor's parent or guardian wish to be excluded from any of these photographs, then the Oireachtas Organisers should be informed in writing prior to the event commencing.
